



#### Greetings at INAA Alumni Reunion 2021

Hello everyone. My name is Kiyoshi Kiyokawa, the chairperson of the NAIST Alumni Association.

First of all, I would like to thank Dr. Berry Juliandi, the President of INAA, and the members of INAA for organizing today's alumni association gathering. I heard that today's 6th Anniversary Symposium of the NAIST Indonesia Office has more than 150 registrations, and the Indonesia NAIST Alumni Association Reunion has more than 100 registrations. I am very pleased that the deep and lively exchanges between Indonesia and NAIST have continued for many years.

As of April 2021, NAIST has awarded approximately 8,700 master's degrees and approximately 1,800 doctoral degrees, for a total of approximately 10,500 degrees. Just as Indonesian people are embodying, NAIST graduates are active all over the world in their respective research fields.

The NAIST Alumni Association supports the graduates so that they can cooperate with each other like a family and contribute more to the society. It may be a little expensive for people outside Japan, but if you pay a permanent membership fee of 20,000 yen, you can enjoy various benefits throughout your life. For example, we will bear part of the cost of the reunion meeting. Although not as active as INAA, the NAIST Alumni Association is gradually continuing its activities.

First, we increased the number of board members to further vitalize the activity. We also hired a staff member who will be in charge of some of the office work of the alumni association in cooperation with the NAIST Student Support Section. In addition, from June of this year, the NAIST Alumni Association is presenting certificate holders that graduates receive. In addition, we have obtained a zoom license to support online meetings with up to 500 participants at a time. This year, various events are planned to commemorate the 30th anniversary of NAIST. The NAIST Alumni Association also wants to hold a large-scale gathering.

Due to the covid19 pandemic, from last year to this year, NAIST has held various events online such as student recruitment briefings, open campuses, entrance exams, and lectures. It was difficult to do new things in the beginning, but we have seen many benefits of new solutions as well. For example, online entrance examinations have made it easier for Indonesian students to take the exam. I am currently the chair of the entrance examination committee of NAIST, but we plan to continue the online entrance examination in the future.

Pandemic is still fierce all over the world, but information technology is establishing a new lifestyle and workstyle. Also, thanks to the vaccine, hope is gradually emerging. I believe that humans can overcome any difficulties by always positively tackling problems with new ideas. It is important for us to produce many graduates with such problem-solving abilities and to connect the graduates to unite their strengths.

I think the INAA and the NAIST alumni association will play a very important role for that purpose. Let's continue to deepen our relationships with each other and create a better world together.

# NAIST Alumni Association History

#### February 1995

With the first students about to graduate, establishing an alumni association proposed by NAIST to promote cooperation between graduates and NAIST as well as between graduates themselves.

#### March 2000

NAIST Alumni Association (NAA) established. (Student Affairs Division provided administrative support). Kazuki Joe (currently professor at Nara Women's University) appointed as chairperson and 24 members and councilors of the board were elected.

#### September 2001
